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After being refused entry by La Llotja School in Barcelona, Pere Ysern Alié began studying at the Pere Borrel del Caso Academy, started by Pere Borrel del Caso, a great Catalan painter.

After his initial studies, Ysern Alié travelled to Rome with his mentor Ramon Tusquets. In 1899 he visited Paris for the first time; there he exhibited at the Salon de la Societé Nationale.

While in Paris, Ysern Alié developed an Impressionist manner of painting that was not so popular in Barcelona.

The present painting is particularly interesting, since Ysern Alié represents one of the most characteristic and important places in Paris, the Moulin Rouge.
