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Natural History Part I, Mushrooms, 1974 is part of a two part series Cy Twombly produced in conjunction with Bastian Gallery in London. The sets, titled Natural History Part I, Mushrooms and Natural History Part II, Some Trees of Italy (1975/1976) are based on an ancient text by roman author Pliny the Elder, Naturalis Historia, published in 77-79 AD. The theoretical text examined natures relationship to art and placed nature as a divine entity.

In the two series of works, Twombly explores a mixed-media techniques using lithographs and grano-lithographs, collotype on Fabriano paper, semi-transparent tracing paper, photochrome with collage, and his own drawings.
