

Françoise Gilot's portrait of the Belgian artist and writer Cécile Miguel dates to the early 1950s.

Miguel, who received the Prix de la Jeune Peinture Française in 1950, sat for Gilot on other occasions. Two other graphic portraits of her by Gilot have appeared on the market in recent years, both dated 1951.¹ In those, as in the present work, Miguel is recognisable by the two bands of hair which fall either side of her shoulders.

Fascinatingly, Gilot has drawn her portrait of Miguel on a Mourlot lithographic sheet. The Atelier Mourlot produced lithographs for Picasso, Braque, Miró, Chagall, Matisse and, from 1950, for Gilot herself, who became the first woman to make lithographs there. One can image her picking up a few spare sheets on a visit to the atelier, to be used later for her pencil and crayon portraits, including the present work.
