Ricard Opisso is a key figure of the Modernist movement in Barcelona and Paris.

He worked as an illustrator and draughtsman at the Sagrada Familia of Barcelona in the last decade of the 19th century.

He was an admirer of Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec and Steinlen, and visited Paris to get to know the artistic avant-garde and Parisian bohemian life.

There, Opisso regularly published drawings in magazines such as *Le Rire,* and depicted Toulouse-Lautrec as well as other images of bohemian life.

The present drawing was executed during one of his visits to the French capital in 1927. It portrays the Place du Tertre: the heart of artistic activity in Montmartre at the end of the 19th century.

Opisso's refined technique incorporates colour using pastel and gouache, which causes his line to be more subtle compared to the drawings he produced earlier in his career.
