MICHAEL PORTNOY (b.1971, USA)

Michael Portnoy is an artist, musician, and Director of Behavior. His practice spans dance-theater, metafunctional sculpture, experimental stand-up, prog-operatic spectacle, abstract gambling, 3-person nightclubs, and Icelandic cockroach porn. Portnoy's art circles the rules of play and communication language itself playing a crucial role in the works. Portnoy refers to his interaction with the audience as "Relational Stalinism," signaling towards a form of participation without "moral double standards" or populist involvement and opting toward a clarification of the artist's imperious role as a producer and a performer.
